Cork School of Music Fleischmann Library in collaboration with the MTU Teaching and Learning Unit are calling for entries to a unique art competition.

All MTU students are invited to submit original artwork for the newly created listening area in the CSM library, The Listening Spot.

The Listening Spot is a space where students and teachers can maximise their listening experience of the CD and Vinyl collections

on newly acquired high-definition audio equipment. This space is intended to be a focal point to help MTU students and teachers progress in their personal and academic development. Your artwork will have the purpose of visually enhancing and celebrating the newly dedicated listening area and raising awareness of the CD and Vinyl collections consisting of Classical, Jazz, Irish Traditional, Opera, Musical Theatre, Blues, and Pop music.

Creative Requirements:

Your entry will consist of two separate landscape designs on A3 (29.7cm x 42 cm). The selected designs will be printed onto two large boards approximately 300cm x 150cm each. Brief for Design I

Suggested themes to be included in this design, are headphones, vinyl turntables, CDs, Vinyl records, and Students listening to music

Brief for Design 2

Suggested themes to be included in this design will be representations of the musical genres included in the library's collection, Classical, Jazz, Irish Traditional, Opera, Musical Theatre, Blues, and Pop. Prominence should be given to Classical, Jazz, and Irish Traditional music genres

Competition Details

1. Your work should be **original** and **unaided**. Please do not copy another person's work. Any source imagery must be indicated at the time of entry. Failure to properly reference any source imagery may result in disqualification.

2. You may submit up to 2 entries per individual. Only individual entries will be accepted and must be submitted directly by you.

- 3. Entrants may submit artwork using computer-aided design or any drawing or painting media suitable for representation on the display boards.
- 4. Images of your artwork should be submitted as high-resolution files, suitable for viewing in high quality.
- 5. The winning artist will receive a prize of \in 300.

6. All the artworks will be judged based on creativity and innovation, choice of theme, detailing and perfection in representing the overall aims.

7. The closing date for receipt of entries to the competition is Wednesday 31st May, at 6pm.
